Hymn of the Dormition (First Tone)

In giving birth you did preserve virginity, and in falling asleep you have not forsaken the world, O *Theotokos*. In living, you were translated, being the mother of life. By your intercessions, deliver our souls from death.

Entrance Hymn (Second Tone): Come, let us bow down to Christ, as we worship Him, the Son of God. Save us, O Son of God, who are risen from the dead. We sing to You, "Alleluia!"

Resurrectional Hymn (Grave Tone)

O Lord by Your sacred Cross You abolished death, and granted unto the thief blessed paradise. The myrrh bearers ceased lamenting and turned to joy. The apostles did preach the Good News at Your command, that You had risen from the dead O Christ our God, bestowing Your mercy upon the world evermore.




